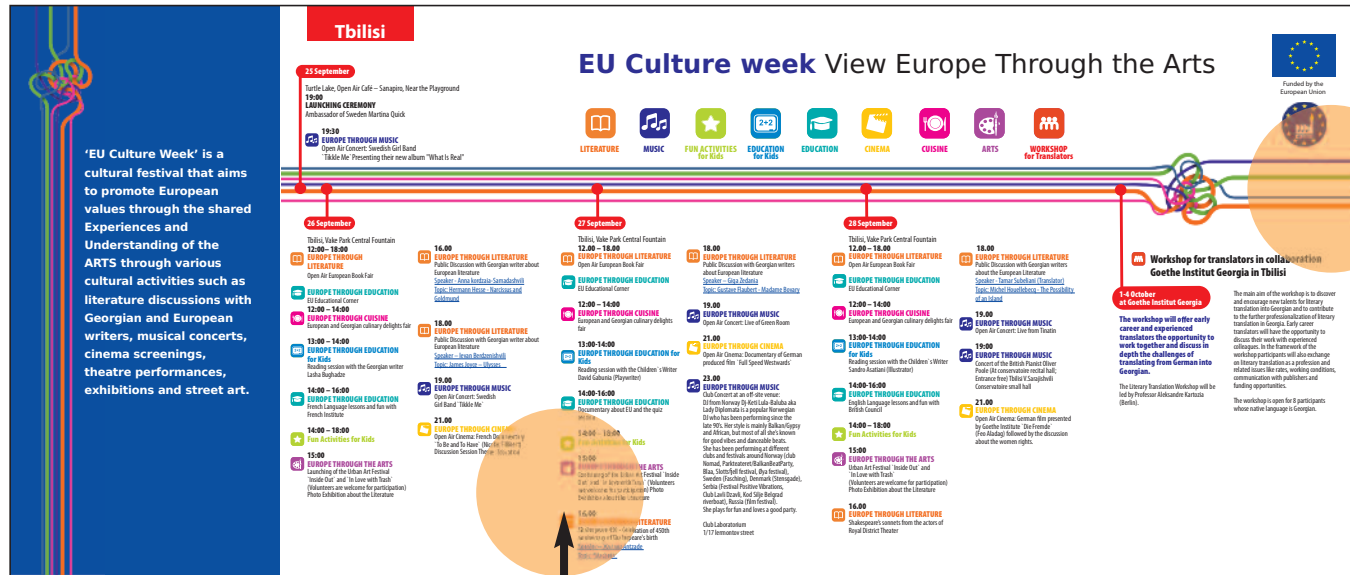
EU Culture week Speakers:

- Levan Berdzenishvili**
Philologist, translator, member of Georgian parliament. Author and actor of Radio program "Radio Chiknadze". Author and editor of books: Democracy and Georgian Culture, 2008; 2011 May Day (University of Tbilisi); 2013 May Day (University of Tbilisi); 2013, Second Edition, 2013.
- Manana Antadze**
Manana Antadze is a Georgian translator and the founder and President of Tamarashvili Theater Foundation. From 1981 to 1988, she was a research associate at the Centre for Contemporary Literary Studies in the "Nikol'skaya University". She has been also working as a freelance translator since 1978 and her numerous translations include William Shakespeare's "Hamlet", Irving Berlin's "Sweet for Me", and J. K. Rowling's "Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone".
- Giga Zedashia**
Giga Zedashia is a Georgian philologist, professor and the Rector of the State University. He studied philology, social studies and medieval studies in Georgia, the United States and several European Universities. He is the author of many publications in the area of the history of philology, social and cultural theory, European literature and cultural history.

EU Culture week Musicians Bands:

- Oliver Poole**
Oliver Poole is a British pianist and composer. He moved to Georgia at an early age when he became the youngest winner of the EPF trophy for the most promising young pianists in Europe aged seven, and since then he has performed with the National Youth Orchestra in eight years old, to become the subject of numerous press features and the headliner at all of them. He has founded and founded the British registered charity "Oliver Poole Award at concert and has also performed at various and festivals.
- Tikla Me**
Tikla Me is an electronic pop-art collective formed by Hilda Herremöster (programming vocals) and Eran Skarsten (keyboards) in Eskilstuna, Sweden. After some EP songs they released their self-titled debut album in 2010 on the label "A Wonderful Melancholy". Since then the duo has transformed and grown. Today it's a whole artistic collective with musicians, singers, dancers, photographers, and video makers who frequently tour Sweden and have performed the shows in Germany, Russia, Belarus and Georgia. In 2013 Tikla Me signed with Gophal recordings and in April 2014 they released the album "Without Heart".
- Green Room**
Green Room is a duo consisting of Boka Jørgensen and Anders Gøtteland. Their collaboration started in 1991 with the musical group "House Quake". Currently, Green room is working on a new project with musician Tom Lundevold. Within the framework of this project, the band has produced several songs, which are very popular in Georgia.
- Dj-Keti Lulu-Baluba aka Lady Diploma**
Dj-Keti Lulu-Baluba is a Norwegian DJ. Her style is mainly Balkan (gypsy and Africa), but mostly she knows her good vibes and danceable beats. She has been performing at different clubs and festivals around Norway (Club Helland, Parkhuset, Musikklabbar, Blue, Strykerfest, Øya Festival, Sweden (Falkenberg, Svensk Strömning), Serbia (Festival Proleter, Vibration, Club Lila), Oslo, Kvaløya Festival, Norway (Øya Festival), among many others. She plays her fun and love-a-good party.
- Tusatin**
Tusatin is a Georgian vocalist, songwriter, author and solo performer. She recognizes herself as an indie performer. The style of her music is a mix of indie pop and electronic music. She is the author of more than ten songs.
